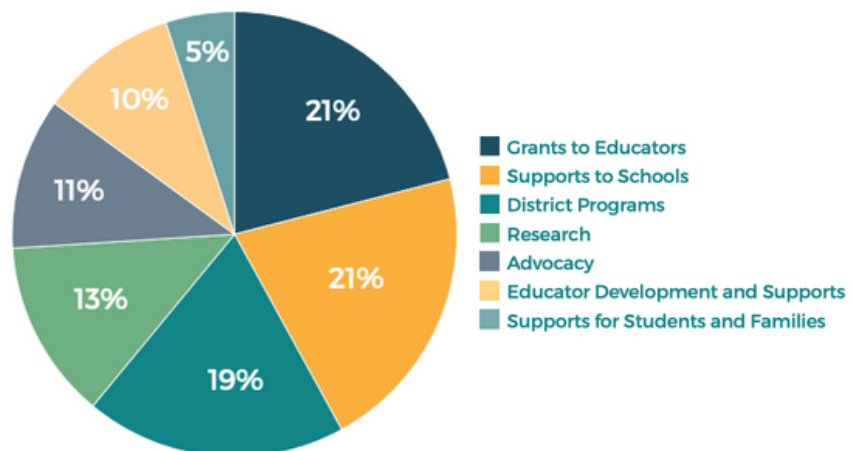

AWARD DESCRIPTIONS



Nelson C. Andrews Distinguished Service Award

The Nelson C. Andrews Distinguished Service Award is given to a leader in the Nashville community who is an advocate for children and youth, has had a significant impact on making Nashville a city that works for everyone, and inspires others to lead and serve. The award is named after the late co-founder of the Nashville Public Education Foundation, Nelson C. Andrews, who was a fierce advocate for Nashville's public schools.



Distinguished Alumni Award

The Public Schools Hall of Fame Distinguished Alumni Award is a celebration of graduates of Metro Nashville Public Schools who have displayed leadership in their professions, have made significant civic, business, and/or community contributions, and have positively impacted the lives of others.



Thomas J. Sherrard Inspiring Innovation Award

The Thomas J. Sherrard Inspiring Innovation Award is given to an organization or program that exemplifies NPEF's commitment to bringing bold, innovative strategies to make a difference for Nashville's public schools. These are bright spots in our community - people doing work to move the needle and find success for our students. The winner also receives a \$10,000 grant.



Annette S. Eskind Inspiring Educator Award

The Annette S. Eskind Inspiring Educator Award is given to a Metro Nashville Public Schools teacher with innovative practices or ideas that inspire students of all backgrounds to fall in love with learning while achieving academic success. The award provides grant funds of \$10,000 to support teachers' innovative practices and reach more students in need.



Inspiring Leader Award

The Inspiring Leader Award is given to a Metro Nashville Public Schools leader demonstrating exemplary educational leadership achievements within public education, with fellow educators, and with students at the district or school level. The award provides grant funds of \$10,000 to support the honoree's transformational leadership practices.
