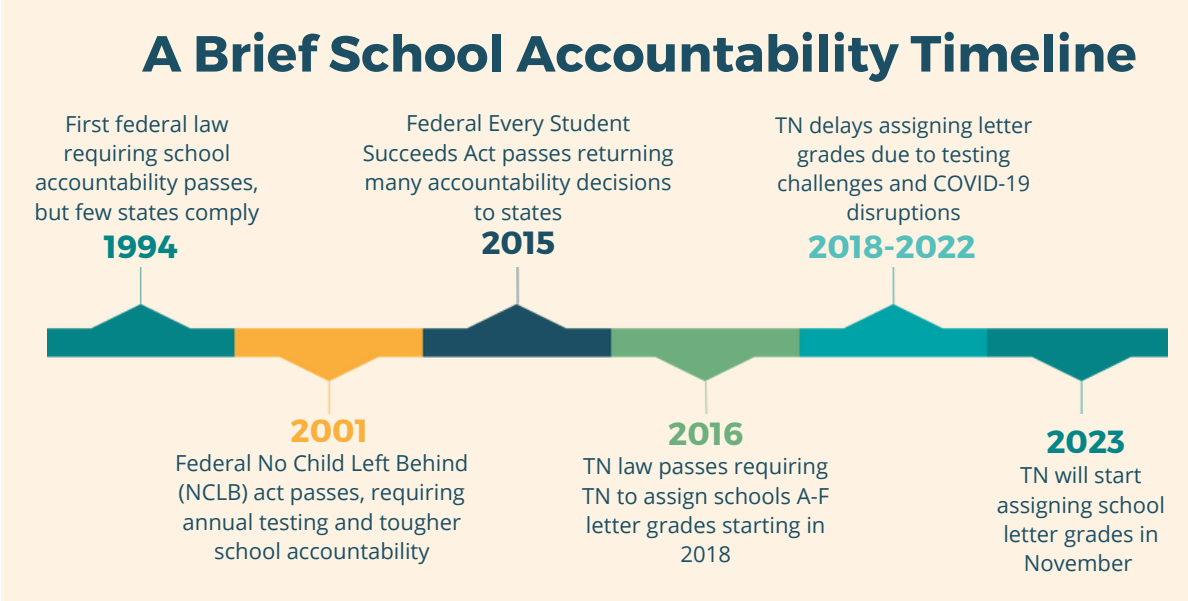
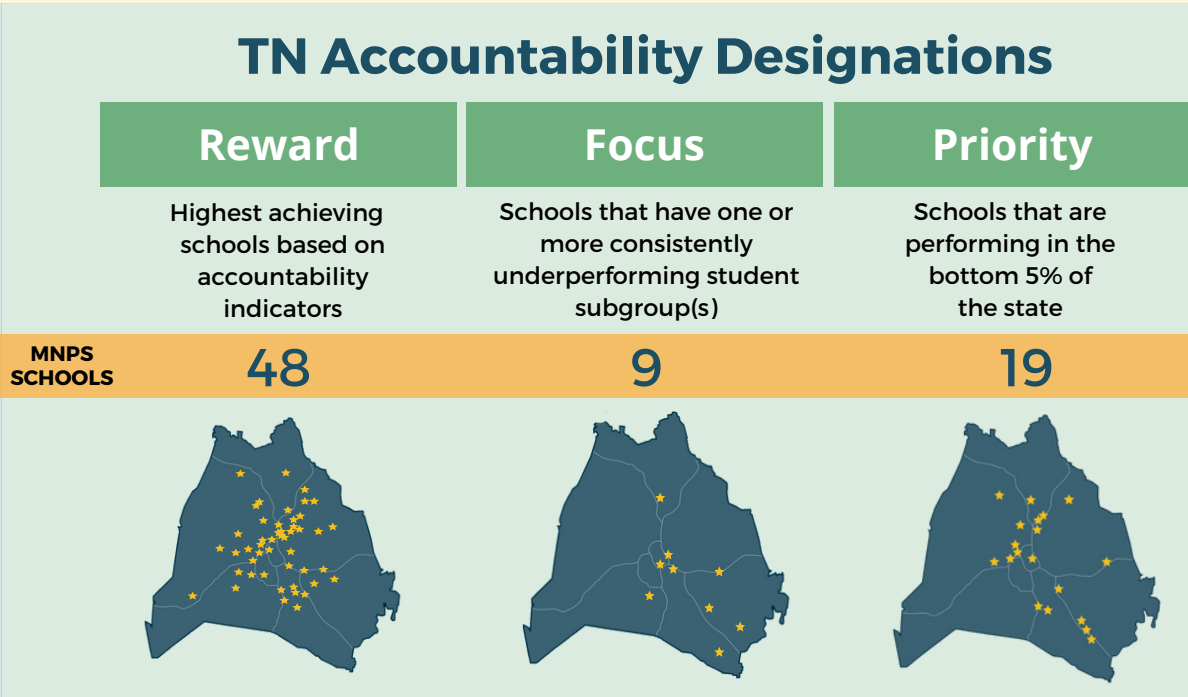
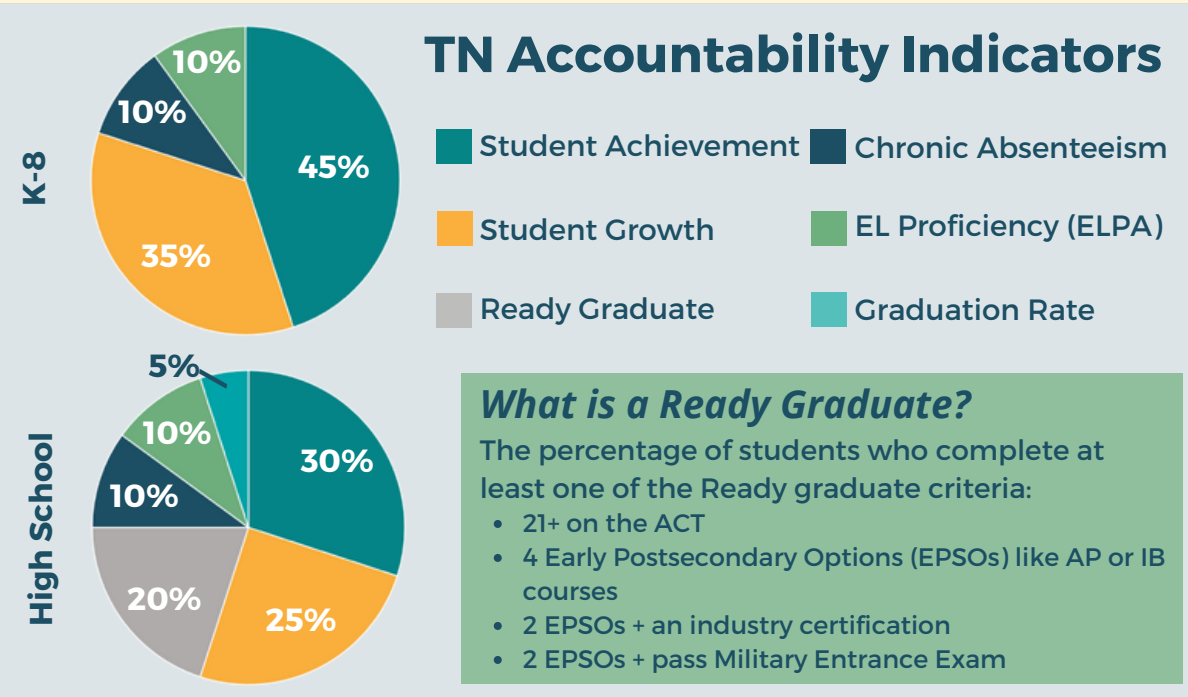


What You Need To Know About School Accountability

Federal law requires states to adopt school accountability systems that establish long-term goals for improvement, provide meaningful differentiation across schools, and assign school designations. States have some flexibility over the indicators and designations as well as the interventions required to support school improvement.
