


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# Federal Funding for Education

The Tennessee General Assembly recently appointed a legislative panel to look into the impact of rejecting federal funds for public education. In the coming weeks, NPEF will be tracking those discussions to keep you informed on this important topic. Read on to learn about the use of federal funds in MNPS, the use of one-time federal COVID relief funds, and what is required of states that accept federal dollars for education.







### All About ESSER

MNPS received three installments of federal COVID relief funds, also known as ESSER, since 2020. These one-time, non-recurring dollars, set to expire in summer 2024, have funded:

# Students with Disabilities

Provide instruction and adequate education for students with disabilities

### **Civil Rights**

Protect students' civil rights based on race, sex, and disability

### **State Testing**

Annually assess students in reading and math in grades 3-8 and once in high school + test science once each in elementary, middle, and high school

### National Testing

Participate in national NAEP testing every two years

#### Reporting

Report annually on the use of funds and abide by auditing requirements

Yes, though no state has done so to date; at least one other state, Oklahoma, is also considering rejecting federal funds this year
