Nashville Honors 25 New Blue Ribbon Teachers for Excellence in Equity, Instruction, and Leadership

Honorees awarded with a \$2,500 cash prize and two surprise roundtrip Southwest Airlines vouchers

NASHVILLE, TENN. – Oct. 18, 2024 – Metro Nashville Public Schools (MNPS), the Nashville Public Education Foundation (NPEF), and Nashville's Agenda Steering Committee honored 25 teachers at the 10th annual Blue Ribbon Teacher ceremony on October 17 hosted by Vanderbilt University. Each Blue Ribbon teacher received a \$2,500 cash prize, a trophy, and two round-trip airline tickets, courtesy of Southwest Airlines. Since 2014, the awards have recognized and celebrated more than 450 of Nashville's top teachers.



For the past decade, the Blue Ribbon Teacher designation has honored exemplary educators for their hard work and dedication in their classrooms and school environments. The Blue Ribbon Teacher ceremony celebrated educators in the following categories: Excellence in Equity; Excellence in Instruction; and Excellence in Leadership.



"Our 2024 Blue Ribbon teachers exemplify great teaching in our public schools and demonstrate the significant impact a single educator can have on students and the community as a whole," said Katie Cour, Nashville Public Education Foundation President & CEO. "We are incredibly proud to shine a spotlight on Nashville's top teaching talent and recognize their daily efforts as leaders and innovators in their schools and district-wide."

Eligible Blue Ribbon Teacher <u>candidates</u> must be full time MNPS teachers for at least four years, have a strong Level of Effectiveness of their performance in the last three consecutive years, and be endorsed by their principals. Winners are determined by a rigorous selection process that includes a review of application materials and evidence by a community panel.

As NPEF furthers its commitment to educator engagement and professional learning opportunities, applications are now open for the fourth annual <u>Teacherpreneur program</u>. Teacherpreneur is open to Nashville public school certificated non-administrative educators, including teachers, school

counselors, librarians, and others working with students. The program harnesses educator innovation to design solutions to real-world challenges in public education. Cohort members will be selected in November 2024, and will engage in sessions at the start of 2025 to prepare for a pitch event awarding \$25,000 in cash prizes to the top teacher-led concepts.
