


# Update: MNPS's 2024-25 A-F Accountability Ratings

In December, the state released the third year of A-F accountability ratings for each district and school. Metro Nashville Public Schools received a designation of "Advancing" for the fourth year in a row.

This past year, MNPS reported the same number of schools receiving an A, and a slight increase in schools receiving a C, D, and F rating

Promotes transparency and provides a consistent way to evaluate performance





Identifies areas for improvement and helps to align resource allocation



Provides disaggregated data about student subgroups and ensures focus on all students


## A-F Indicators

Poverty and A-F ratings are highly correlated; districts and schools with higher percentages of economically disadvantaged students have more D or F schools and fewer A or B schools

While A-F systems are correlated with poverty, several schools in MNPS that serve high percentages of economically disadvantaged students saw significant growth, bringing their A-F ratings up

Schools with Level 5 growth serving 50-60% ED students

- KIPP Academy Nashville
- KIPP Nashville College Prep
- KIPP Nashville College Prep Elementary

Schools with Level 5 growth serving 60.1%+ ED students
